### **Election of Officers**




### Reminder and a look ahead:

# UPDATE AND CALL TO ACTION ON BELTWAY EXPANSION

n February 13, the Maryland Department of Transportation State Highway Administration (MDOT) released its list of "recommended screened alternatives" and they all involve adding toll lanes. (The "No Build" Alternative 1 is being carried forward for baseline comparison purposes only.) MDOT dropped Alternative 2, which would improve the operations of the existing transportation system through Transportation System Management and Transportation Demand Management. MDOT also dropped all of the public transit alternatives.

On February 6, the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission (M-NCPPC) had sent MDOT a detailed memo with recommended objectives and metrics for considering the alternatives; this was ignored by MDOT. MDOT had also declined M-NCPPC's request in November for funding assistance for some staffing needs to support the necessary work of M-NCPPC as a cooperating agency to the Managed Lanes Study.

Although MDOT received an overwhelming number of public comments that oppose widening I-495 and I-270, it dropped the relevant options from its "screened alternatives." Its decision ignores the public, and threatens homes, communities, and the environment by rushing to sign an \$11 billion, 50-year contract to expand I-495 for

privatized toll lanes, like the ones in northern Virginia where tolls can top \$46.
